6.2 Health and Safety Objectives

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HEALTH AND SAFETY OBJECTIVES

Top management, in conjunction with the health and safety team, have created the following objectives to help track the efficacy of the Occupational Health and Safety System as it applies to this Part 2 Section:

"Ensuring a 100% project compliance rate on legislated items and documented compliance improvement on internal requirements, by monitoring and auditing our sites and locations."

The nature and scope of the work that J-AAR conducts cannot realistically ever be free from hazards. Top management is committed to reducing the risk to our workers. J-AAR will track leading indicators such as compliance with sector specific hazard assessments and communication requirements. These include workplace inspections, task assessments/permits, JHA's, and toolbox talks. J-AAR is committed to ensuring a 100% project compliance rate on legislated items and increased compliance on internal requirements. These will be tracked through Power BI and observations.

The health and safety team will provide top management with statistics and data for these items weekly, and discuss as required at the monthly meeting.

"The reduction of our overall Total Reportable Injury Frequency Rate."

J-AAR's top management is committed to reducing the risk to our workers.

J-AAR will track lagging and leading indicators, injuries and property damage. Incident investigations will help determine appropriate corrective actions resulting in a goal of reducing the injury frequency and severity rates by 10%.

"Increased compliance for supervisor training year over year by 25 percent".

At an annual training review meeting, top management and the health and safety team review all supervisors' training records. Training plans are made and communicated to supervisors at the beginning of each year. J-AAR is setting a goal of increased compliance with the previous year's training plans and targets of at least 25%.
